Dear parents and carers,

Earlier this week, our Year 2 children went on the annual residential trip to Delamere Forest. They thoroughly enjoyed all of the exciting, outdoor activities such as pond dipping, stream shuffling, toasting marshmallows around a campfire, orienteering and den building. They packed an awful lot into their short stay! The staff were very proud of the children for being brave as they stayed away overnight and developed their independence whilst looking after their belongings, carrying out night-time and morning routines and even stripping the bedding! I am sure that these skills will be transferred to home and as they move into the juniors and attend any future residentials.
